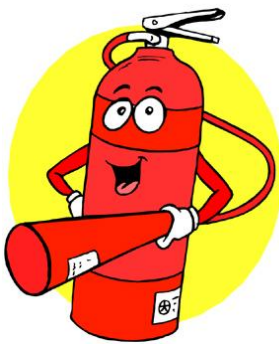




GET A FRESH START AND A CLEAR CONSCIENCE

If you have an outstanding warrant...this is your chance to clear up past troubles and start the new year and decade with a clean slate. On **Wednesday, January 13**, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., members of the clergy, police and representatives from the justice system will welcome and process individuals with outstanding warrants at the Greater Friendship Baptist Church on George W. Engram Blvd. in Daytona Beach. The proactive initiative, called Operation Safe Surrender, is modeled after a successful program pioneered by the U.S. Marshals Service in 2005. Daytona Beach will be the first city in Florida to offer this type of program which will include first appearance hearings at the church. The idea is to create a safe and inviting atmosphere - family members are welcome and officers will be in plain clothes. While the program is not an amnesty program, people who turn themselves in will receive special consideration. .

PROTECT OUTDOOR PLUMBING DURING COLD SPELL

The Utility Department wants to remind residents about the importance of protecting outdoor plumbing to avoid the inconvenience of lost water pressure due to broken pipes. Residents with "back flow preventers" can keep their neighborhood safe by insulating the device that is exposed to freezing temperatures (see picture above). Backflow devices are found in neighborhoods where reclaimed water is available. Mandated by the state in recent years, the devices prevent contamination of drinking water. They are made out of galvanized metal pipe and brass and can usually be found near a home's water meter.
