There will be a code enforcement workshop on **Thursday, January 7**, 6 p.m., at Police Headquarters, 129 Valor Blvd.

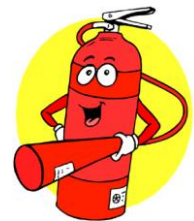
