Votran is offering a trolley service on New Year's Eve on A1A, between Granada and Beachcomber avenues.

Please use caution when celebrating with purchased fireworks. In Florida, fireworks that explode or leave the ground are illegal to use. Additionally, Fireworks are prohibited on all Volusia County beaches. Residents are asked to call 386-671-5100 to report illegal firework activity. (In the event of an emergency, residents should dial 911.)

Firework safety tips include the following:

- Never let children handle, play with or light fireworks
- Do not use alcohol with fireworks
- Do not alter any firework or make home-made fireworks
- Use outdoors only
- Always have water handy (a garden hose and a bucket)
- Dispose of fireworks properly by soaking them in water and then disposing of them in a trash can
- Never throw or point fireworks at other people
- Do not use near pets or livestock
- Never shoot fireworks in metal or glass containers
- The shooter should always wear eye protection and never have any part of the body over the firework
- Stay away from illegal explosives
