

Crews prepare work area as Hurricane Dorian approaches

Updates :

Today through Saturday, workers on the construction site at the intersection of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. and Magnolia Avenue are preparing the area for potential impacts from Hurricane Dorian. In preparation of the storm, crews will fill the holes, move equipment and remove or secure temporary signs and other construction-related items.

The intersection remains closed.

Local traffic is permitted from Orange Avenue north to the work zone and from International Speedway Blvd. south to the work zone. All through traffic is being routed around the area via Orange Avenue, Segrave Street, Lockhart Street and International Speedway Blvd.

In preparation of the storm, the detour signs will be removed from the area.

All businesses along MLK are accessible to pedestrians. Pedestrians should not walk through the work area. If walking around the work site perimeter, pedestrians are urged to use caution.

This week the construction crew has been focused on tying in the new reuse pipe crossing MLK and preparing to install the sanitary sewer system with the placement of the first structure at the MLK and Magnolia Ave. intersection.

Project Overview:

The \$2.6 million project will completely reconstruct the road's surface, update underground utilities, widen sidewalks, install decorative lighting features and landscaping and add on-street parking on the east side of the roadway.
