

## **MLK Streetscape work underway after Hurricane Dorian**

*Area receives no major damage*

### **Updates:**

The crews working on the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. streetscape were able to start working at the site Thursday morning and have restored the temporary detour signs around the construction area. The area received no major damage and there is no standing water on MLK as a result of Hurricane Dorian. Officials believe the storm will only cause a three-day delay to the project. After bringing equipment back to the site, crews are working to finish tying in the new reuse pipe crossing MLK by Saturday. Beginning next week, they will be installing the new sanitary sewer system structure at the MLK and Magnolia Ave. intersection.

Local traffic is permitted from Orange Avenue north to the work zone and from International Speedway Blvd. south to the work zone. All through traffic is being routed around the area via Orange Avenue, Segrave Street, Lockhart Street and International Speedway Blvd.

All businesses along MLK are accessible to pedestrians. Pedestrians should not walk through the work area. If walking around the work site perimeter, pedestrians are urged to use caution.

### **Project Overview:**

The \$2.6 million project will completely reconstruct the road's surface, update underground utilities, widen sidewalks, install decorative lighting features and landscaping and add on-street parking on the east side of the roadway.
