

**Sidewalk and curbing
complete from
Magnolia Avenue to ISB**

Underground utility work also complete on northern section

The roadway on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. (MLK) between Orange Avenue and Magnolia Avenue remains open to local traffic. Underground utility work in the MLK and Magnolia Avenue intersection is complete, and crews are working on reconstructing the road base. The intersection will be closed for safety reasons intermittently when construction activities warrant a closure.

The underground utility work is now complete between Magnolia Ave and International Speedway Boulevard (ISB), and the sidewalk and curbing are also complete. Electrical crews will be working on installing the streetlight poles in the next couple of weeks.

The Magnolia Avenue and MLK intersection, as well as the portion of roadway from the intersection north to ISB, is scheduled to get its first layer of pavement in the next two weeks. The entire roadway from Orange Avenue to ISB is scheduled to be paved with the final surface next month.

Customers can park temporarily in the right-of-way on the side streets to access the businesses. Pedestrians should not walk through the work area. Volusia County Small Business Assistance Grant Program

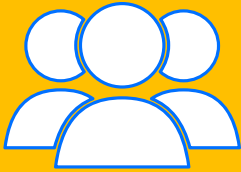

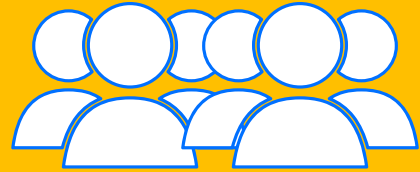




COVID-19 Small Business Assistance Grant Program



1- 25 FTE
\$3,000



26- 50 FTE
\$5,000

To qualify, businesses must:

- certify they suffered financial impact due to COVID-19 & loss wasn't reimbursed by insurance or other program
- be a physical business located in commercial/ industrial space
- be licensed to operate in Volusia County or local city where located, if license required
- have been operational & actively conducting business in Volusia County on or before Dec. 1, 2019

RENT AND MORTGAGE ASSISTANCE

The Volusia County Council has earmarked \$5 million for emergency rent and mortgage assistance for Volusia County families and individuals impacted by the coronavirus through loss of employment.

Renters and homeowners can apply for assistance for payment of current and, if they remain eligible, future payments. To qualify, applicants must meet income eligibility requirements, the rent or mortgage must have been current as of March 13, and the dwelling must be in Volusia County. Accepted applicants may receive up to \$1,500 a month for three months.

Look for the rent application at volusia.org/C19RA and the mortgage application at volusia.org/C19MA. Completed applications can be submitted through the website or mailed to: **Community Assistance, 110 W. Rich Ave., DeLand, FL 32720.**

Assistance will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis. A limited number of applications will be accepted based on funding availability.
