POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND BOARD

City Charter, Sub-pt. D, § 3, amended by Ord. No. 96-261, 96-405, 10-322, and Florida Statutes, Sections 175.061 (1)(2), 175.351[15(a)4], and 185.05(1), and 185.35(4)(a) regulate the selection of five Trustees: two (2) of whom, unless otherwise prohibited by law, shall be legal residents of the City, who shall be appointed by the Daytona Beach City Commission, one (1) of whom shall be a Police Officer Member of the System and one (1) of whom shall be a Firefighter Member of the System, who shall be elected by a majority of the Police Officers or Firefighters, respectively, who are Members of the System. The fifth Trustee shall be chosen by a majority of the previous four (4) Trustees as provided for herein, and such person's name shall be submitted to the Daytona Beach City Commission. Upon receipt of the fifth person's name, the Daytona Beach City Commission shall, as a ministerial duty, appoint such person to the Board of Trustees as its fifth Trustee.
