How Vehicles Get Burglarized

The majority of vehicle burglaries involve criminals looking for open windows and unlocked doors or smashing windows to get inside. A criminal with the "know how" can conduct a car break in seconds.

Car break criminals are known to work in groups, sometimes as part of a well-orchestrated plan involving multiple people going through neighborhoods and checking for unlocked vehicles.

Criminals will walk by vehicles and look for high-dollar items in plain view to take.

Thieves will often have look-outs to notify of approaching law enforcement or pedestrians.

Some of the most sought-after items by criminals include purses, backpacks, GPS units, smartphones, tablets, laptops, wallets, cash and firearms.



Car Break Security Tips

- Don't leave valuables in your vehicle where others can see them.
- Lock your doors and close your windows.
- Be aware of your surroundings and park in a well-lit area or security-occupied lot.
- Invest in an Anti-Theft Device.
- Always take your valuables with you or lock them in your trunk.
- Record your valuables in the DBPD mobile app under Asset Tracker in the Community Resources section on the home page. This will help in identifying and recovering stolen items.
- If you observe any suspicious activity or what you believe is a crime in progress, dial 911 immediately.
- Don't be a hero and put yourself in danger. Get a good description of the suspect(s) to give to the dispatcher.

If You Become A Victim...

- Report it to police immediately.
- Try to preserve the crime scene and do not touch the vehicle or its contents.
- Be aware of your surroundings. The suspect(s) may still be in the area.
- Advise the responding officer of suspect information and/or stolen items.
- Request a case number to give to your insurance company.
